Saginaw Bay WIN Announces Spring Action Grant Recipients

Eight organizations will share nearly \$8000 for projects that incorporate environmental and community objectives

Eight local organizations will share nearly \$8000 that has been awarded by the Saginaw Bay Watershed Initiative Network (WIN) for projects that incorporate environmental and community goals. WIN awards *Action Grants* that are a maximum of \$1000 twice each year, in addition to its larger grant programs. The *Action Grants* require a 1:1 match. "Our Action Grant program is designed to encourage creativity and push groups to think about new, innovative ideas that can not only benefit the environment and their communities, but also serve as models for future projects", said Michael Kelly, Great Lakes Director of The Conservation Fund. The Conservation Fund administers the Saginaw bay WIN project. Past Action Grants have been awarded to projects focused on energy efficiency, habitat improvement, public access to natural resources and more. "These grants, though small relative to our other grant programs, often provide that key investment that groups need to get their ideas to the implementation stage", continued Kelly.
